28 men made their only appearance as a pinch runner: Jack Aragon, Ivan Bigler, John Corriden, Bob Daughters, Otis Davis, Joe Evers, Charlie Fallon, Ralph Gagliano, Gary Hargis, Mickey Harrington, Eddie Hunter, Dan Jessee, Owen Kahn, Mel Kerr, Mike Kosman, Tom Maher, Danny Mahoney, Garth Mann, Bob Mavis, Ray Medeiros, John Oldham, Gene Patton, John Sanders, Hank Schmulbach, Ralph Shafer, Ray Shook, Leo Taylor, and Ollie Welf.

38 people played in the field but never made a plate appearance: Jesse Baker, Joe Bennett, Jim Boyle, Sam Brenegan, Alex Burr, Russ Ennis, Jack Feller, Archie Graham, Buddy Hancken, Bob Hegman, Joyce, Jack Karst, Duke Kelleher, Chris Kitsos, John Lickert, Matt Luke, Terry Lyons, Jim Mahady, Fred Marolewski, Charlie Marshall, Sandy McDermott, John Merritt, Cy Neighbors, Otto Neu, Johnny O'Connor, Harry O'Neill, Elmer Ponce, Arch Reilly, Bob Scherbarth, Jack Smith, Red Smith, Harry Stanton, Nick Testa, Homer Thompson, Frank Verdi, Fred Walden, Phil Wisner, and Bart Zeller.

20 people pitched but never retired a batter: Lou Bauer, Sid Benton, Joe Brown, Fred Bruckbauer, Bill Childers, Frank Dupee, Art Gardiner, Doc Hamann, Will Koenigsmark, Pat McGehee, Bill Moore, Mike Palagyi, Jay Parker, Jim Schelle, Jim Scoggins, Doc Sechrist, Gordie Sundin, Marty Walker, John Wood, and Larry Yount.

4 players were hit by a pitch in their only plate appearance: Harvey Grubb, Cy Malis, Fred Van Dusen, and Ham Wade.

The only 2 people to appear in the same game were Harry O'Neill and Jim Schelle, who both appeared for the A's on July 23, 1939. Two of the pitching performances deserve mention. Jim Scoggins started for the White Sox on August 26, 1913. He walked the leadoff man, was removed from the game, and was saddled with the loss. Bill Childers came into the game in relief for Louisville on July 27, 1895, faced 8 batters, gave up 2 hits, walked 6, and then vanished completely. Childers has not been seen since.

Did You Know?

Did you know that there has never been a major league ballplayer named Heine? All the people known as Heine or Heinie, such as Zimmerman, Peitz, Groh, and Meine were all named Henry. I know of no one in the past 60 years of baseball who went by the name Heine.

The Wrong Brother?

Our November Mystery of the Month comes from Dick Thompson. Henry Edson Matteson debuted with the Phillies in 1914 and later played with the Senators in 1918. We list his birth as September 7, 1884 in Guys Mills, Pennsylvania, a small town in Crawford County. According to Ray Nemec, Matteson's first professional experience was in the major leagues at the age of 29. He then pitched with a variety of minor league teams until he was 43.

He could have played semi-pro ball, but it does seem odd that he would break in at the major league level at 29 and pitch until age 43. Where was he before? Matteson had a brother George who also pitched professionally from 1912-15. Is it possible that we have the birth date attached to the wrong brother? Anyone know anything about the Mattesons?
