# Peggy Moore Found

Frank (Peggy) Moore of the 1905 Pittsurgh Pirates and out May/June 1998 Mystery of the Month has been found by Jim Holl. Jim identified the player through newspaper accounts and tracked down Moore's family. He discovered that Moore was born September 12, 1877 in Dover, Ohio and died May 20, 1964 in Portsmouth, Ohio. For this, Jim wins this month's Find of the Month award.

## A Ball From a Missing Player

Richard Malatzky found the following passage in a book about Baltimore baseball:

"By now, authentic baseball artifacts from 1870 or earlier are of extreme rarity. Then, when a single baseball sufficed for all 9 innings, it was customary to present it to the game winners, who if in funds would have it shellacked and lettered with team names, date, and score. Such a baseball, sewn from a single piece of leather, descended in the family of Wally Goldsmith of the Marylands. It was then poresented to the Babe Ruth Museum by Lloyd Kirkley. The ball commemorates a victory over the New York Mutuals, on a date no longer legible."

#### Selko Notes

Jamie Selko sent along a couple of interesting tidbits of information. Jim Golden once struck out 34 batters in a 14 inning game when he was a senior in high school. In the state championship

game that year (1954), he struck out 20 in 7 innings; the other out was a ground ball back to the mound. Ron Kline pitched 5 consecutive no-hitters his senior year in high school, two of which were perfect games. Jim Greengrass lettered in 5 sports in high school, football, baseball, track, soccer, and tennis.

#### A Gray Area

A player we list as James D. Gray played second base for Pittsburgh in the Players League June 17-18, 1890. Joe Simenic found three different notes on Gray in the June 21, 1890 issue of Sporting Life.

On page 3, it says, "Owing to Robinson's injury, Pittsburgh put an amateur named Gray at second, and while he is credited with three errors, he also made several brilliant plays and batted hard."

On page 5, it says, "Jimmy Gray, who is playing second for Pittsburgh in place of Robinson, disabled, will be one of the best second basemen in the profession if he continues. He has done great work, now that he has got over nervousness in the first game."

Then on page 12, it says, All of the Allegheny city officials are talking of the brilliant debut with Hanlon's team made by the well-known former professional, Jim Gray. Gray has not played professionally since he was with Syracuse in 1887, and has been employed in the city engineer's office."

So is the guy the same as James W. Gray who played with Pittsburgh in 1884 or someone else entirely? Would someone like to research this? This is our *Mystery of the Month*.
