NEGRO LEAGUES COMMITTEE PUBLICATION

Those of you who saw the special book section of the recent USA TODAY BASEBALL WEEKLY got to see part of the cover of the NLC Book and a brief description. I guess we have to get it out now. Larry and I are editing galleys and Mark Alvarez is putting it all together (no exact release date as yet.) We think you'll be pleased with the content. It should greatly enhance research on the Negro Leagues. We are also pleased that we nave found so many great unpublished photos and that many will be available for individual purchase. Needless to say, Larry and I are slightly behind in returning phone calls and letters; please bear with us.

NEGRO LEAGUERS AND THE HALL OF FAME

This will be the last time this section will appear in the newsletter since it is unlikely that Negro Leaguers will ever be selected by the Veterans Committee. If black players could dominate at the Major League level after integration how likely is it that only 11 players from 60 years of segregated play would be deserving? It's very unlikely. The Hall of Fame went to SABR for help in determining qualified candidates from the 19th century and the Negro Leagues but the Veterans Committee obviously didn't bother with reading any of the recommendations. The Hall of Fame should abolish the Veterans Committee before the public actually believes the Veterans Committee speaks for the Hall itelf. The callous disregard the Veterans Committee has for Negro Leaguers and the Negro Leagues is truly unbelievable.
