C. V. Matterson Found

A player known only as C. V. Matterson pitched for St. Louis of the Union Association on June 13, 1884. Richard Malatzky managed to identify him and track him down earning him the Find of the Month award.

Richard looked through the 1883-85 issues of Sporting Life and found him referred to as Matteson as well as Matterson. He is also mentioned as being from Ohio. Richard then went to the 1880 Ohio census and found all the Mattesons in Ohio who fit the logical age range. There were four of them, three of whom were brothers. They were Charles F (23), Claude L (21), and Clifford (18) and they lived in Seville, Ohio.

When Richard then looked at the 1900 Ohio census, he found a Clifford V. Matteson, born November 1861, and living in Seville, Ohio with his wife Cora. Richard Topp has access to an Ohio death index and found a death for Cora Matteson in Medina County on November 30, 1923. He sent this information back to Richard Malatzky, who then wrote the Medina County District Library. They sent him the obituaries of both Cora and Clifford Virgil Matteson, mayor of Seville, Ohio. The mayor died of acute indigestion December 18, 1931 in Seville. Quoting from the obituary, "Matteson, whose early days were marked by his activity as a baseball player and who retained his interest in the national pastime to the end..." Obviously, this is our boy. Tremendous job of research!

The David Drew Mysteries

Our Mystery of the Month for March/April comes from Richard Malatzky. We list David Drew as the player who played with Philadelphia and Washington in the Union Association in 1884. Richard found a note from early 1884 stating that David Drew, of last year's Maple Leafs of Milwaukee, has been signed by the Chicago Unions.

A little later in the winter, he found a note in the Johnstown, Pennsylvania notes that Drew, who lives in Johnstown, will probably play in Johnstown this year. Later in the winter, that Drew signed with Oil City in the Iron and Oil League.

On May 14-15, Drew played with the Philadelphia Keystones. Both games were played in Altoona. On May 20, Drew played for the Washington Nationals, also in Altoona, and then continued with them.

The Drew from Johnstown and David Drew were apparently two different players, so it would seem apparent that the Johnstown Drew would be the major league player. Johnstown is only 30 miles from Altoona. Does anyone want to look into this in Johnstown or Altoona?
