NEW CHAIRMAN, CO-CHAIRMAN OR EDITOR SOUGHT

Many of you have communicated to me that you did not receive the July 1990 newsletter, which apparently got lost in transit so I am including a copy of that mailing along with this newer offering. In any case, two newsletters per year is not enough, and as my own projects and my SABR obligations are all way behind schedule, some relief is needed, either in the form of a new chairman for this committee, or at least a co-chairman or newsletter editor to see that committee mailings are sent out with greater timeliness. Whoever takes over the duties will need greater support from all of us, since the membership has thus far contributed precious little to the content of past newsletters. The committee as a whole will benefit by your submission of any nineteenth century items, oddities, studies, and musings that any of you might send to the leadership.

BOOK ON EARLY BASEBALL RECOMMENDED

Mark Alvarez has authored a book on baseball from its origins through the late 1870s called The Old Ball Game, published as part of the Redefinition "World of Baseball" series. Profusely illustrated with the assistance of Mark Rucker, this is an attractive and informative 192-page review of baseball's beginnings and the formation of professional leagues.

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION STATISTICS

Much of my free time this summer and fall was devoted to working on National Association batting statistics for the next edition of Total Baseball, which is due out this coming spring. With the 1871 box scores completed, we have complete stats for that season, including RBIs, ERAs, fielding averages, and stolen bases. The next four seasons are far from complete (1872 and 1873 are each about half done, while '74 and '75 are barely started), but when John Thorn and Pete Palmer asked for "something" on those years, we had Michael Stagno's day-by-day batting sheets to fall back on. These sheets have each players' daily batting record including bases on balls and extra base hits in most cases. By adjusting these figures to remove walks from at bats, estimate missing extra-base hits, and matching opposing pitchers to team totals for each game, Pete and I were able to come up with "preliminary" batting and pitching stats for 1872 thru 1875. Stagno did no fielding averages, so we have no new listing on positions and the ERAs that Total Baseball will publish are derived by using a formula of 40% of all runs assumed to be earned across the board, which will benefit pitchers like Al Spalding (who was backed by the best fielders) more than it will Candy Cummings (who will probably have a greater percentage of runs actually unearned).

A perusal of the 1871 league leaders that appear on a separate sheet in this mailing reveals some interesting features. A pitcher, Ryne Wolters of the Mutuals led the league in RBIs, Ross Barnes scored better than two runs per game (a feat he duplicated in 1873), and .795 was good enough to lead the league's third basemen in fielding. It should be noted that George Wright's .412 batting average and .816 fielding average as shortstop are not included because he was limited to 16 games due to an injury. Likewise Ross Barnes's fielding marks (.837 in 15 games at short and .873 in 16 at second base) are not on the list. Richard Topp is keying the game-by game statistics into his computer, and hopefully someday we will be able to offer these to members for the cost of reproduction.

The 1872 thru 1875 leaders are taken from the adjusted Stagno statistics and show Ross Barnes as the dominant hitter and Al Spalding as the dominant pitcher. The underlined stats in the team totals are the best in the league on a per-game basis.

ATTENDANCE FIGURES

Various members have been dabbling in attendance figures recently, and Richard Topp tells me that he hopes to get season attendances into the next edition of the Macmillan encyclopedia. Dean Sullivan has gone through the Cincinnati club's books for 1886 thru 1888 and has come up with game-by-game figures, while Bob Bailey has done game-by-game research for the 1890 Louisville Cyclones, and I have been working on season statistics for the St. Louis Browns, Boston Red Stockings, and both the NL and AA for the year 1891. Here are the figures so far:

The missing data for Boston may be available readily from revenue figures given out at the shareholders' meetings held on Dec. 27, 1876 and Dec 15, 1880 if anyone wants to go through the Boston newspapers to check.

Art Ahrens submits the following list of large single-game growds and would appreciate any clarifications anyone may find in the hometown newspapers. In St. Louis, for example, the Post-Dispatch reports the attendance this way: "Secretary Heilbronner reports the turnstile count was 26,320," for the game of May 14, 1899. But the Globe-Democrat was more skeptical, stating "that the turnstile count was announced as 26,000, but that should be taken with a grain of salt," and then estimating the crowd at 21,000. 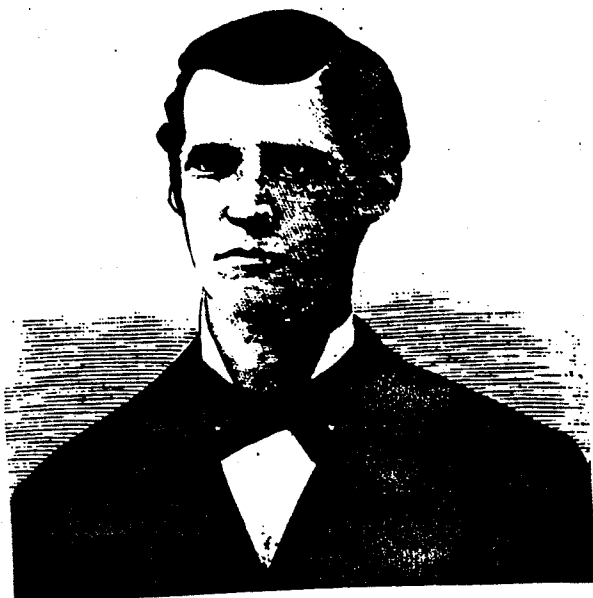

"EARLIEST" BOX SCORE UNCOVERED

In a front page story last October 4th, the New York Times printed the box score of the game between the New York Club and a Brooklyn team played at the Elysian Fields in Hoboken on October 21, 1845. One Edward L. Widmer uncovered an account of this game in the New York Morning News. This newsletter mentioned this game in November 1987 while printing a box score of the return match in Brooklyn played three days later. Here is the box score of the earlier game of October 21st.

Although this score lists "Hine" and "Ayres" while the New York Herald box score for the return match lists "Hines" and Meyers", the lineups appear to be the same with the batting orders juggled slightly. If anyone can get to the New York Historical Society and copy the New York Morning News account of the October 21, 1845, game, I'm sure the committee would be interested in reading it.
