Gai Berlage and I gave a presentation on Female Images in Baseball, comparing and contrasting the AAGPBL with the three women in the Negro Leagues. This was the only presentation dealing with women In baseball so a question was raised for everyone to think about-how can we raise the consciousness about women in baseball at the National convention? what kind of things can we as a committee do to capture this interest? The success of our committee depends on the help of all of us in order to pass information along, help others with research and see that the public is kept informed. Our committee meeting was held at 7:30 am on Friday and we had a pretty good turnout considering the early hour. Thanks to all who got up early to come. A number of good ideas were discussed after introductions were made. We got the opportunity to hear about research projects some of our members are working on and requests for help. Two main ideas seemed to come from this meeting: 1)work on statistics where they are incomplete or don't exist at all. This requires finding out exactly what statistics there are and how accurate they are and then beginning to fill in the gaps. This will require people sending me boxscores from newspapers where the various teams were located during the period 1943-54. If you have any boxscores or would like to scan the microfilm for a particular city please let me know so we can try to avoid duplication of the same work. 2)a player panel in San Mateo for 1998 because so many former players live in California. It was also suggested that we try for a smaller version next year in Louisville, possibly with players from Indiana area. If you have any suggestions for players we could invite or you would like to help work on this please let me know as soon as possible.

Another topic brought up at the meeting was letting the membership know about upcoming events that you might hear about. You can send the information to me to post in our newsletter and on our web site for more timely events.
