Also, the baseball cards by Larry Fritsch have some players stats and the AAGPBL Players Association has many of the stats.

A number of committee members have individual projects they are working on and continue to need help. Many of their research questions are contained below. We are also working with the umpires committee trying to pull together information on umpires in women's games. If you have any articles, box scores, etc that contain the name of umpires from games please send them in. If you are interested in helping with this project we need the names of the umpires, the date of the game, the place where the game was played and the teams involved. Please send all this information to me and it will be passed on. This can involve games presently and from the past. We are just beginning this project so almost anything is needed. Updates will begiven each newsletter to let you know what is still needed.
