New Baliplayer Discovered

Ivan Edward Bigler, long thought to be a "phantom" ballplayer, was shown to be a real player by Dick Thompson. For this, Dick wins the coveted Find of the Month award. Dick discovered that Bigler pinch-ran for Bill Rumler of the St. Louis Browns in the game of May 6, 1917. At one time, Bigler was thought to be a misprint for Sisler. However, George Sisler played the entire game at first base. After Bigler's playing career ended, he became a football coach for a college in Worcester, Massachusetts. By the way, Lee Allen obtained a questionnaire for Bigler (filled out by Bigler himself) in 1966.

Charles Newman

We had listed Charles Newman as catching for St. Louis on June 13, 1891. Ralph Horton determined that the catcher that day was actually John Munyan so Newman becomes an 1892 debut player. His new debut date is September 11, 1892.
