She was a recipient of the 2021 SABR Analytics Conference Research Award for historical baseball analysis/commentary.



On August 3rd, Shakeia interviewed Jay Jaffe, a senior writer for FanGraphs, author of The Cooperstown Casebook and creator of the JAWS (Jaffe WAR Score) metric for Hall of Fame analysis. He previously was a guest of the Rocky Mountain SABR chapter on a virtual meeting. He founded the Futility Infielder website, was a columnist for Baseball Prospectus, a contributing writer for Sports Illustrated, and a contributor to more than a dozen books including Baseball Prospectus' Extra Innings. He has been a recurring

STUDENTS, APPLY FOR A FALL 2023 INTERNSHIP WITH SABR

The Society for American Baseball Research is seeking remote interns to work during the Fall 2023 semester. An internship with SABR will involve responsibilities across a variety of disciplines, possibly including:

- Working with the Director of Editorial Content or Publications Director to help publish and/or produce content for our website at SABR.org
- Working during an online SABR event
- Working with other SABR staff members on organizational duties, membership renewal drives, customer service

Interested candidates should be able to demonstrate basic office-related computer skills and have a reliable Internet connection for remote working. Experience with WordPress (or other content management systems) and Zoom (or other virtual-conference platforms) is a plus. A working knowledge of baseball — and an awareness of the game's general history and basic statistics — is required.

The internship is an educational opportunity that may count toward college credit, covering 15-20 hours per week with a flexible schedule. The internship will be for a fixed period of time and is designed to provide the intern with skills and training that may be applicable to working in a nonprofit research environment or in other research-based organizations.

TWO HISTORICAL LOOKS ON DENVER BASEBALL

In conjunction with the 30th anniversary of the Colorado Rockies this season, two different documentary features were shown in July, on AT&T Sportsnet Rocky Mountain, and on KTVD Channel 20 in Denver.

Two recent episodes of AT&T Sportsnet Rocky Mountain's "The Club" featured the long time history of Baseball in Denver, from the 19th century, to the Bears, to the Zephyrs, to the Colorado Rockies. Former Rocky Mountain SABR President Matthew Repplinger, along with historian Jay Sanford, founder of the National Baseball Museum Bruce Hellerstein, collector Marshall Fogel, Negro Leagues Baseball Museum president Bob Kendrick, former broadcaster Norm Jones, former Zephyrs GM Robert Howsam, Jr., and former Bears associate GM Bob Burris were all featured, talking about some of the events in the Mile High baseball history. Check out AT&T Sportsnet Rocky Mountain throughout the balance of the season for these encore airings of "The Club," to learn more about Denver's baseball minor league history.

Another recent documentary aired in Denver called "When Colorado Went Major League," produced by former 9News anchor/reporter Kyle Dyer and Julie Andrews. This documentary features about the transition from the minors and the majors, the behind-the-scenes on how financing for Coors Field was created, how Denver's organizing committee wooed the National League and the MLB owners, despite an ownership situation that had their share of issues. Dyer and Andrews talked with nearly 30 people for this documentary including Matthew Repplinger, along with former Colorado Governor Roy Romer, former Denver Mayors Frederico Peña and Wellington Webb, and current Senator John Hickenlooper.

WILL IT BE TODD HELTON'S TURN IN COOPERSTOWN IN 2024?

Congratulations to Fred McGriff and Scott Rolen as the 2023 National Baseball Hall of Fame inductees, who were formally enshrined in Cooperstown on July 23rd. Will the Colorado Rockies get their second inductee with first baseman Todd Helton in 2024?

Helton, who finished 11 votes short from induction in 2023, will have a solid chance to enter the hallowed halls in Cooperstown in 2024 in his sixth year on the ballot. Helton is a .316 career hitter with 2,519 hits, 592 doubles, 369 homers, 1406 RBI, with a career .953 career OPS in 17 seasons with the Rockies.

Helton could be part of a solid 2024 Baseball Hall of Fame class, with Billy Wagner and Andruw Jones among the top returning candidates. First-year candidate Adrian Beltre should be a lock, with strong cases from Joe Mauer and Chase Utley. The Veterans Committee will have some strong candidates among the Modern Era Managers, Executives, or Umpires (Lou Piniella, Davey Johnson, and George Steinbrenner among potential candidates), .









SABR MINOR LEAGUE BOXSCORES PROJECT

The SABR Minor League Baseball committee is working on a major project, putting together a Minor League boxscores project and scoresheet database from every affiliated minor league and independent league between 1902 and 2004, before MLB took over control over the MILB boxscore database in 2005. The project to help collect historical data from boxscores to compile statistics from over 3,500 minor league seasons, many not in the Baseball Reference website database. This MILB database is planned to be an equivalent to retrosheet.org (for Major League Boxscores), and a way to uncover and find gamelevel data for all games, ensure currently published minor league totals are accurate, discover and identify players not currently in the player registers, and publish data in formats usable by researchers and analysts.

Chris Moyer is beginning to compile Western League Boxscores from the 1950's including the Colorado Springs Sky Sox, Denver Bears, and Pueblo Dodgers. SABR LANDMARKS COMMITTEE UNVEILS NEW SABR BASEBALL GRAVES MAP

The SABR Landmarks Committee is thrilled to introduce the new SABR Baseball Graves Map!

Using data graciously provided by former SABR Director Fred Worth, the Baseball Graves Map contains burial locations of over 9,000 players, managers, owners, executives, and other significant figures from Major League Baseball, the Negro Leagues, the All-American Girls Professional Baseball League, and more.

Worth has spent nearly two decades visiting baseball grave sites around the globe, beginning with a 2004 trip to Hall of Famer Travis Jackson's grave in Waldo, Arkansas, near his home. Worth has supplemented his own travel database with information on burials from the SABR Biographical Research Committee, Gary Ashwill of the Seamheads Negro League Database, Retrosheet, family members of players, and other sources.

His current tally is staggering (and continuing to grow): 9,459 graves in 4,186 cemeteries in 2,852 cities in 48 states, Washington, DC, and England (visited by proxy thanks to a friend who was there).

If you are familiar with the SABR Baseball Map, you will find the SABR Baseball Graves Map is similar in look and function. In the coming weeks, we will be announcing a Zoom session where Dr. Worth will join us for a demonstration of the new SABR Baseball Graves Map.
