Walter S. Walker Found

On July 31, I was sitting at home lamenting the fact that I had no *Find of the Month*. Then I got a phone call from Richard Topp saving the day and informing me of the apprehension of Walter S. Walker of the 1885 Baltimore(AA) team. Rich wins the award not for finding Walker but for finding a college student at Michigan State who found Walker for us.

Rich sent him a list of missing Michigan players and he located Walter S. Walker, an attorney, who died in Pontiac, Michigan in 1922. His obituary said that his body would be sent to

Ionia, Michigan for burial.

I called Joe Simenic to obtain corroborating evidence. Joe had a note from *Sporting Life* in 1893 that ex-player Walker, the attorney, was insane and being sent to Pontiac, Michigan. It also mentioned that he was born in Ionia. Looks like a winner to me.

The Quest to Find Joe Quest

Our July Mystery of the Month and the Number 1 guy on our Top 20 Most Wanted List is Joseph S. Quest. Joe Quest actually had a rather lengthy career beginning in 1871 with the Cleveland Forest Citys and ending in 1888 with Lowell of the New England League. In between he had a somewhat undistinguished career yet is responsible for adding the phrase "charley horse" to the English language.

Quest was born in November of 1851 in New Castle, Pennsylvania, the son of Jacob and Mary Jane (nee Lewis) Quest. Jacob Quest died in May of 1883 in New Castle and is buried in Greenwood Cemetery. Quest's mother died in 1857. I contacted Greenwood Cemetery and didn't get any information; however, the person I spoke with was not very knowledgeable. It might behoove us to try again.

Joe Quest did have an older brother and sister. Mary S. Quest, who was born in 1845, married John A McConnell. Also, Homer J. Quest, Joe's brother, was born in 1847. I could find nothing on either one of them in the Pennsylvania census but Richard Topp suspects that they may have

moved to Indiana.

The last anyone has heard of Quest he was working as a bookkeeper for the City Clerk of Chicago, a man named Cap Anson, in 1907. He was implicated in an embezzlement scandal and disappeared. I had heard that he may have gone to Georgia but that has not been proven. I have

contacted a relative of the Quest family who has been unable to track him as well. Hopefully, tracking his brother and sister might provide a clue to Joe's whereabouts. Thanks to new committee member Myrl Swanson for providing much of the new information on Quest.
