The Fourth Annual Roland Hemond Award, which goes annually to the major league executive who has been a contributor to both the history of baseall and the scouting profession, will be presented on Saturday to Paul Snyder, the long-time scouting director and baseball operations director of the Atlanta Braves. His career as a player and executive with the Braves covers half a century. He will join Roland Hemond, Bob Howsam, and Pat Gillick as Hemond Award winners.

Roland will be on hand to make the presentation.

OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION AWARD

THE BIO PROJECT

He did catch on as player procurement director for the Mid-Missouri Mavericks in teh independent Frontier League, but resigned that position recently and has put baseball in the memory bank after 37 years at the major league level. He has only three committments to the game at this time:

 - 2 Continue as secretary of the Midwest Scouts' Association for at least another year.
 - 3 Sift thru 50 bank storage boxes of letters, records, files, notes, 10,000 tryout camp registration cards, who knows what else, in an effort to do a book involving a life devoted to scouting.

In addition, I'm currently writing a column in the local daily paper and deeply involved in Democratic Party politics on the local scene. I've done 200 pages on a book about grass-roots sports officiating, and have done a small book of family history wrapped around the Clark Family Newsletter.

Rod has changed jobs for the better, but added responsibility greatly reduced the time he was able to devote to his ongoing project of "whom signed whoms" and all the other data he has compiled with that original project.

We welcome ourselves back - and ready to challenge the future.
