# Edward Trumbull Found

Edward J. Trumbull, pitcher and outfielder with Washington of the American Association in 1884, has been located by Bob Richardson. Bob thus captures the *Find of the Month* for February. Bob located the cemetery Trumbull was buried in. The cemetery didn't have a place or date of death but Bob managed to find a date of burial in Trumbull's home town of Chicopee, Massachusetts. This led to locating the place of

death in Kingston, Pennsylvania.

His obituary in the Wilkes-Barre Record does mention his baseball career which as many of you know, does not often happen. It of course fails to mention Trumbull's stellar statistics. He hit .116 and had a 1-9 record as a pitcher. Washington could not decide whether he should be a pitcher or an outfielder and wisely chose neither.

#### Parker's Nickname

Last month's Find of the Month, Roy Parker, has for years been listed with the nickname "Spots". Bill Haber spoke with Parker's sister and learned the origin of that nickname. As a player, Parker had a tendency to perspire. When he wasn't pitching he would be sitting on the bench perspiring. When he got up, there would be two wet spots left on the bench where he was sitting. Hence, the nickname "Spots".

#### They Call The Man Uriah

"Bloody Jake" Evans was an outfielder with a variety of teams between 1879 and 1885. For years we had listed his real name as Jacob Evans, similar to the way we erroneously listed Garland "Jake" Stahl as Jacob. Jack Dougherty found proof via Baltimore city directories and Evans' obituary that his real name was Uriah L. P. Evans. One can only shudder to imagine what the L and P stand for. As far as I know this is the only major league player ever named Uriah. (Why couldn't it have been Danny Heep?)

#### Lost Your Brashear?

Bob McConnell recently wrote and informed me that Roy Brashear's entry with Louisville in 1899 was not Roy but his brother, Norman. Joe Simenic did further research into the Brashears and discovered that Norman's entry with St. Louis in 1902 was not Norman but his brother, Roy. (I wonder if they fooled their wives the same way.) Norman's debut date thus becomes June 25, 1899 and Roy's becomes April 25, 1902.

#### Mystery of the Month

John J. O'Neill caught two games for the New York Giants both in 1899 and 1902. He should not be confused with John Joseph O'Neill, a catcher at the same time who was a member of the O'Neill family who had four ballplaying brothers. Our mystery man was apparently born in New York City and worked for the New York City water department. I made a feeble attempt to locate him in the 1900 New York census but gave up when I discovered how many John O'Neills there were in New York. And that doesn't count the possible variations of the spelling of his last name.

For most of the first decade of this century, O'Neill was catcher for a professional team in Hoboken, New Jersey. Interestingly enough, the pitcher on that team was none other than William "Dummy" Deegan. I would suspect that something could be found on him by perusing Hoboken newspapers of the 1902-1910 era.
