# THE ROLAND HEMOND AWARD

The Third Annual Roland Hemond Award, which goes annually to the major league executive who best combines (or combined) a deep sense of baseball history and a deep feeling for the scouting profession, will be presented this year to <a href="Pat Gillick">Pat Gillick</a>, the former general manager of the New York Yankees, Toronto Blue Jays,, the Baltimore Orioles, and currently the GM of the Seattle Mariners.

Pat will be on hand for the committee meeting on Saturday morning and will be honored at the annual awards luncheon at noon on Saturday.

Pat brings a deep background of scouting formed first with the Houston Astros when he wandered the prairies of Canada's central provinces. He has always had great respect for athletic ability and, in those formative years, he signed young baseballers like <u>Clark Gillies</u> and <u>Bob Bourne</u>, who went on to greatness in the National Hockey League, leading the New York Islanders to NHL's Stanley Cup.

We look forward to a Friday evening of Pat's tall tales and the opportunity to introduce him to all of you on Saturday morning. Roland will do the introduction honors at the awards dinner.

### DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARDS

Your chairman will present two distinguished service awards at the annual committee meeting. The awards - which will carry no name at the current time other than "Distinguished Service Awards" - replace the <a href="Tom Greenwade Award">Tom Greenwade Award</a>, which was retired after the 2002 committee meeting.

The current awards, picked by your chairman at this time, will not be based on finding the most "who signed whoms," but on total research in the scouting field. In the future, at least one award will be made annually. Multiple awards will be forthcoming if and when necessary.

The 2003 recipients will be announced at the committee meeting.

## THE COMMITTEE MEETING

Our committee has been given a 90-minute slot from 7:30 a.m. till 9 a.m. on Saturday. July 12. We asked for two hours, but were limited to 90 minutes. The place: Room 1. Not too hard to remember. The other committee meeting schedules are attached.

# COMMITTEE AGENDA

A tentative agenda (and with 90 minutes, we can have little discussion):

- 1 Introduction of Your Chairman, Co-chairman Rod Nelson, Roland Hemond, and Pat Gillick.
- 2 Report from the chairman in regard to general direction, finances, etc.
- 3 A lengthy up-date on the huge project of compiling the lists of scouts and their "who signed whoms" and all the problems of correcting and adding names to those lists.
- 4 A review of the tremendous work done by Roland Hemond, most of it on a face-to-face basis, of getting verbal accreditation from players concerning exactly who signed them.
- 5 Discuss where we go with all the data Rod has pulled together and how it will be integrated with data from other SABR projects.
- 6 Review where we are with the committee project of a book of bios to be published by SABR.
- 7 Review where we are in our co-operative project with the Hall of Fame Museum regarding a scouts' display in Cooperstown. We hope to have John Odell from the Museum on hand to update us.
- 8 Twenty minutes with Pat Gillick...so bring your questions for Pat. He and Roland will have an all-too-shoft panel on whatever they decide to do.
  - 9 Presentation of the Distinguished Service AWards.

# HUGE MAILING

Your chairman has just completed two mailings which totaled 800 letters to all the full-time scouts in baseball. The letter was two-fold in its direction. First - 600 area scouting supervisors, working at the amateur player level, received directions about how to join SABR and, even as non-SABR members, to be a part of the Hall of Fame Museum's project to develop a scouts' exhibit. The scondary thrust of the letter was to aid Rod Nelson in updating the "Who Signed Whom" list.

In a second mailing of 200, our committee contacted the veteran scouts who now mostly serve as scouting directors, special assistants, and those devoted only to major league and/or professional coverage. This group, with a long history of scouting, could be the most valuable to SABR.

The committee now owns an updated mailing list of almost 800 active, full-time scouts. Now let's hope at least a small percentage of this noble 800 will join us in SABR projects. You never know until you ask.

# GREG WHITWORTH

The first input from the mailing of 600 was from <u>Greg Whitworth</u> of Mill Creek, Washington. He had compiled, as a personal project, a

huge amount of data concerning draft-era scouting - which is being integrated into Rod's storehouse of scouting data. Greg is now a member of our scouting committee.

# PAPER PROOF

agenda for the committee meeting will be a review of Rod Nelson's project of an expanded "Who Signed Woms" which will include not only the signing scout or scouts, but also draft position (after 1964), college, signing year and first major league season, and a notation regarding the source of the information.

We'll have on hand at least one print-out of that pile of data, which may look like the national budget. That printout should give us an idea of the amount of data which has been compiled. OL' Clark, who still relies 100% on paper, looks forward receiving his Sears Catalogue of Scouts.

## CO-CHAIRMAN

With permission from SABR's Board, your chairman will elevate Rod Nelson from Vice-Chairman to Co-Chairman. The reason? Since Rod is the major worker in our group, he needs to share equally in the direction of the committee's business. Thus, he will become our co-chairman. If SABR resists such a move, we'll call on the Bush Administration to declare war.

# YOUR (NOW CO-) CHAIRMAN

Since our last committee newsletter, Ol' Clark, the international director for the San Diego Padres, has been very busy doing non-SABR business. Since the Padres pay for the process we do have to spend some time on Padres' business. My travels have taken me to Australia, New Zealand, Mexico (three times), Curacao, Aruba, Venezuela, The Dominican (twice), H ondruas, Nicaragua, Panama, and spring training in Peoria, AZ. In the 3½ years I've been a Padre, I've been responsible for the signing of 110 players - 105 of them who speak Spanish. Which brings us to the next comment concerning the problems of "Who Signed Whom."

WHO DID SIGN WHOM?

Each year, I review the press guide for the Padres and make corrections regarding who signed whom. As the director, I use my name only where I was either the sole contractor or was deeply involved in the signing of a player. When the area scout was the person who found the player and did the negotiation, that scout was credited with signing the player. If a part-timer or an associate scout was the first to see the player and brought the player to the area scout, both receive credit for that player as it should be. I make sure all credits are updated with our public relations department.

So what happens when I open the press guide for 2003? The updates had not been included. My usual nasty letter was fired off to the proper folks. We hope all will be made right in 2004.

But what about a researcher doing the San Diego who signed whoms? His data for 2000, 2001, 2002, is not correct - though it is correct according to San Diego's Padres...until 2004. As Norman Macht said at the 2002 committee meeting - we're probably doing a never-ending job. But at least we're trying. There is one given fact - Major League Baseball will do damned little to help us...except for people such as Roland Hemond, Gary Hughes, Bob Howsam, Pat Gillick, Peter O'Malley and a small handful of others.
