Mystery of the Month

This month's mystery comes courtesy of Steve Bennett. Walter Kinlock played one game at third base for the St. Louis Cardinals August 1, 1895. We list him with a birth of 1878 in St. Joseph, Missouri. This is apparently wrong. Chris Von Der Ahe picked him up off the Denver sandlots apparently wrong. He apparently played with sandlot teams in Pueblo in 1896. In 1897 he played with St. Joseph, then with Atchison in the Kansas State League in 1898 before returning to St. Joseph in August of 1898.

He played with Bloomington, Illinois from 1899-1902. In 1903, he began the season with Davenport, Iowa then went to Joliet, Illinois. In 1904 he was making a living as a cigar salesman (shades of Billy Alvord) but it is unknown where he was living or what happened to him after 1904. In 1900 there is a Josephine Kinlock living in Denver who is the proper age to be his mother. If anyone has any more information, please get in touch with Steve or me.
